Paradise Island Pool Opens June 27, 2015



Make a splash this summer in the new outdoor leisure pool at Pioneer Park. The city will have a grand opening weekend June 27-28, 2015, opening the gates to the public with a community fair and giveaways. A pool dedication with city council and advisory committees, as well as soft opening activities, is being planned for the week of June 22.

The pool logo serves as the primary visual identification for the city's new outdoor leisure pool. The logo is a representation of the game-themed facility, with water featured underneath and above the text representing the pool, the dice reflect the game theme and are numbered one and five to celebrate the year of opening. The logo will be visible throughout the facility signage and used for promotional activities.

Season passes go on public sale May 5, 2015, at the Commerce City Recreation Center. Staff will be promoting discounted season pass sales only (not drop-in or punch cards) due to the fact the facility will not be open for a full season (Memorial Day through Labor Day). As an incentive for residents to purchase season passes at the Recreation Center in advance of the pool opening, there will be a 50 percent discount valid through June 17, 2015.

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A 40 percent discount will be valid beginning June 18 - end of the 2015 season. Staff estimates that the pool will be open to the public approximately 62 percent of the 2015 season.

Reservations for cabana rentals are currently open to the public and must be made in person at the Recreation Center. Cabana reservations begin July 1 through the end of the 2015 season.

Garbage & recycling program update

Most residents have now been using the new trash and recycling cans for a few months. Since the last update in late March, staff has continued to assist with requests, and all indications point to overall number of calls/requests beginning to decrease. Staff has tracked the number of calls received from citizens with issues about program implementation. To date, 315 calls for service have been received (133 since the March 30 update). This represents approximately 2.18 percent of customers (315 of 14,475 accounts). Below is a summary of the nature of the calls from the public to city staff between Jan. 26 and April 24:

Staff has continued to work with Waste Management (WM) staff to ensure the calls being made to their call center are being handled properly. From March 1 through April 30, WM has received 1,335 calls. WM truck drivers have continued to run into pick-up issues along routes. If cans are not serviceable for some reason, the driver leaves a hanging tag on the can explaining the reason. WM has distributed approximately 4,000 service can tags at the time of pickup.

WM is trying to charge a \$50 delivery fee to residents who order additional containers and service. The City does not believe this is consistent with the contract and sent a letter to WM telling them to cease charging this delivery fee. The City has received a response from WM and the city attorney's office is reviewing.



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Staff was at the recreation center April 25 with recycling information to celebrate Earth Day. Residents were able to ask any trash service questions and also donate 18- gallon recycle bins no longer being used under the new service. With a busy day of volleyball and swimming, approximately 75 took the opportunity to stop by the booth to learn more about recycling. The next formal presentation to Council will be by May 18.

Subject: 2015 General Assembly Week 14 Legislative Report

Date: May 4, 2015

With less than 60 hours left in the legislative session, it is a race to sine die no later than midnight on Wednesday, May 6. A total of 664 bills have been introduced; Commerce City is tracking approximately 67 bills for possible direct or indirect impacts on the city, its employees, businesses and residents. Sixty-one bills tracked by the city have already been postponed indefinitely.

The city's position, consistent with its [approved legislative principles](#), is in parentheses. SPECIFIC LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

- **Owner-Occupied, Multifamily Housing:** SB 15-177 passed the Senate with bipartisan support on a vote of 24-11. SB 15-177 was introduced in the House last week and assigned to State, Veterans, and Military Affairs, where it died on a party-line vote. Municipalities throughout the region are investigating local ordinances and the coalition is evaluating statewide next steps.
- **Urban Renewal & Tax Increment Financing:** The Senate approved [SB 15-135](#) 30-5 and the bill now awaits a hearing in the House. The Senate Finance Committee took [HB 15-1348](#) off the table over the weekend to have an amendment drafted that would replace the entire text of the bill for stakeholder review and input. Several stakeholders met with the senate sponsors of the bill this morning to give reactions to the amendment. The result is yet another redraft of the amendment and its consideration later today by the Finance Committee. If the amendment were to pass, there is no assurance the full Senate would vote to accept the changes. There also has not been assurance from the Speaker that she would accept Senate changes to the bill and force a conference committee.
- **Photo Red Light Cameras:** The photo radar prohibition bill ([HB 15-1098](#)) was amended on the House floor to require a public vote to continue using or expanding automated

vehicle identification system and allowed photo technology to be used on school buses. Governor Hickenlooper weighed in on the legislation, sending a letter to the Speaker of the House and President of the Senate requesting they dispose of the bill. The bill overwhelmingly passed the House on a 38-26 vote. The Senate State Veterans & Military Affairs Committee is currently hearing the legislation. [SB 15-276](#) to address photo enforcement elections was approved by the Senate and awaits House action.

OTHER BILLS OF INTEREST

- ***Police Reform Bills***

Several police reform bills were postponed indefinitely, including police body camera grant program (HB 15-1285), police training improvements (HB 15-1287), profile prohibition (HB 15-1288), chokehold prohibition (HB 15-1291), prosecution involving police misconduct (HB 15-1286). Others are moving forward include HB-1290, Citizens Right to Record, SB 15-185, Concerning Data Collection & Community Policing, SB 15-217, Data Collection After Officer-Involved Shootings, SB 15-219, Transparency After Officer-Involved Shooting, and SB 15-218, Disclosure of Misrepresentations by Peace Officers.

- ***HB 15-1007, Local Government Retail Marijuana Taxes (Postponed Indefinitely)***

The House amended the bill to only apply to excise taxes and the Senate postponed the bill indefinitely in the State Veterans & Military Affairs committee.

- ***HB 15-1264, Homeless Persons' Bill of Rights (Postponed Indefinitely)***

HB 15-1264 created the "Colorado Right to Rest Act," and defined specific rights for those experiencing homelessness. Additionally, it would've allowed an individual who believes his or her rights have been violated to take civil action and enabled a court to award up to \$1,000 per violation and attorney's fees to the prevailing party.

- ***SB 15-212, Stormwater Management and Water Rights (Support)***

Modern stormwater management requires regional stormwater facilities designed to control and prevent destructive high flows by releasing or infiltrating stormwater gradually, within 72 hours for all but the most severe storms. Regional stormwater management facilities produce stream flow rates that are closer to the natural hydrograph than would occur without these facilities.

- The Bill preserves the ability of existing stormwater facilities and post wildland fire facilities to continue to operate to protect public health and safety

- Language in the bill specifically allows that the operation of future facilities may be challenged by water rights holders who allege injury to water rights.
- The State Engineer supports and has asked for this bill so that storm water facilities can continue to operate without water rights administration requirements that have never been applicable to these facilities.
- The Bill will protect communities from debris flows and flash flooding caused by wildfires.
- The Bill is the result of over four months of negotiations with stakeholders

Stormwater management is critical to public health and the safety of property throughout Colorado. So long as storm or flood flows are stored only for that period of time determined necessary to meet public health and safety demands, and the water is not placed to any other intervening beneficial use, the construction and operation of stormwater control facilities should not be subjected to the water rights administration and adjudication processes. A conference committee has been requested to address chamber amendments.
