Good Morning,

I read the article about your sex offender program through the group WAR. As the wife of a registrant, I wanted to chime in and let you know how important a progressive thought process like yours can be. My husband was placed on the registry a decade ago, long before I met him. Prior to his offense, he worked in grocery store management...making his way to a very successful position by the time he was 22. But, due to depression that followed a miscarriage, he made a huge mistake that cost him his career. It was a non contact offense and he was placed on probation. He quickly found a job at a screen printing company, having zero experience and making 1/3 of what he was accustomed to. But, as you know, a job is a job to someone with the scarlet letter of the registry. Because of this job, that my husband STILL has, he now makes 40k a year (which is enough to allow me to be a stay at home mom in our area) and has opened his own screen printing business on the side that becomes more successful as time passes. If it weren't for him finding a long term job following his offense, I would have never met him and I would not be raising a family with him. Next year, he will be eligible to be removed from the registry and then we will begin the process of him adopting my son who he has stepped up to raise when my ex abandoned us. Which is ironic because we're always told that the registrants are the "bad guys." Your program will change lives. Thank you for realizing that people need someone to have faith in them while holding them accountable.

Rep. Perlmutter's District Update – October 2015



There's no place as beautiful as Colorado in the fall. Of course, I happen to think there's no place as beautiful as Colorado, period. I enjoyed every moment of being home for five weeks listening to constituents, walking in parades and riding light rail with hard working folks. Recently, I returned to Washington, D.C. to start working on a lengthy laundry list of important legislative items that need to get done before the end of the year including to keep the government open, find a long-term funding solution for the Highway Trust Fund, extend the Wind Production Tax Credit, and, pay our bills by lifting the debt ceiling.

We started on some of those items this week with the passage of a clean **Continuing Resolution** to fund the government. The bill does not take vital funding away from Planned Parenthood and finances the government through December 11, 2015. It's my hope we can avoid a dramatic and prolonged debate over these next few months and instead work together to pass a long-term highway transportation bill and pass a budget that continues to invest in Colorado and America.

The highlight of the week, however, was the passage of the authorization and appropriation to complete the new **Denver VA medical facility in Aurora**. This ensures the Army Corps of Engineers and Kiewit Turner can sign a permanent contract to complete the facility and move forward with this project without further delay. There is no doubt the VA mismanaged this project from the start. And as disappointing and unacceptable as this situation has been, we are where we are. I am pleased Congress is finally doing its part to finish this project by lifting the spending cap and securing the full remaining balance to complete this world-class medical facility for Rocky Mountain Veterans.

Earlier in the month, I travelled on the W Light Rail Line to talk with constituents during their morning commutes about transportation and infrastructure issues and other concerns or questions. These mobile office hours provided an opportunity to talk with constituents at a time and place that's most convenient for them. I heard from several constituents about the valuable role of public transit in their daily commutes and what can be done to improve our transportation network across the metro area.



Funding for several programs of the **Highway Trust Fund** is scheduled to run out October 29, 2015. Lack of action or delayed action could cause programs financed through the trust fund to shut down, partially or completely. This is why we need a strong multi-year surface transportation reauthorization to provide certainty and allow for long-term planning for our country's infrastructure needs.

In advance of Congress' vote to fund the Highway Trust Fund, [I sent a letter](#) to U.S. Department of Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx and Deputy Secretary Victor Mendez outlining transportation priorities for Colorado and the 7th Congressional District. The letter also includes several recommendations to better invest in our nation's infrastructure and grow our economy.

Along with Senator Michael Bennet and Rep. Jared Polis, I helped introduce a bill to help communities in southwest Colorado and New Mexico recover from the **Gold King Mine** blowout that released acid mine drainage into the Animas and San Juan rivers. The *Gold King Mine Spill Recovery Act of 2015* will ensure the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) continues to work with local communities and tribes by requiring the agency to compensate those who were affected. It also requires the agency to work with the states and tribes to

DEFINITIONS

Development Plan Approval:

Development approval usually is an administrative review of a development plan that covers the final details for site design, landscaping, architecture, and public improvements to ensure compliance with the development and design standards and provisions of the city's Land Development Code. A development plan should provide the character and layout of the lot or lots including the exact location; the use of each building and area; architectural elevations of buildings indicating height, materials, and color; detailed landscape plan; streets, curb cuts, lighting; utilities, drainage, and other easements.

Building Permit:

A building permit is the formal approval of building plans by Commerce City's building and safety division indicating they meet the requirements of prescribed codes. It is an authorization to proceed with the construction or reconfiguration of a specific structure at a particular site, in accordance with the approved drawings and specifications.

Certificate of Occupancy (CO)/Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO):

A Certificate of Occupancy (CO) is a document issued by Commerce City's Building & Safety Division certifying a building's compliance with applicable building codes and other laws, and indicating it to be in a condition suitable for occupancy. This certificate is necessary to be able to occupy the structure for everyday use.

A Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) grants the same rights as a certificate of occupancy, however, it is only for a temporary period of time. Temporary certificate of occupancies are generally sought after and acquired when a building is still under minor construction, but there are certain areas that are deemed to be habitable, and, upon issuance of TCO, can legally be occupied or sold.

Grading Permit:

A grading permit is required for any excavation, fill, or other earthwork, unless the project is exempted by the Land Development Code. A grading permit may or may not be a precursor to additional construction activity.
