Join RTD for a Live Telephone Town Hall Meeting Oct. 21

The Regional Transportation District (RTD) Board of Directors is hosting live interactive town hall meetings between Sept. 28 and Oct. 22 to talk about bus and light rail service, plans for opening four rail lines and bus rapid transit in 2016 and other RTD plans. District K Director Paul Solano (covering Commerce City, Brighton, Lochbuie and portions of Thornton and unincorporated Adams County) will hold a meeting Wednesday, Oct. 21, from 6:15-7:15 p.m.

Successful leaf and green yard waste event

The City hosted the Leaf and Green Yard Waste Event this past Saturday from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Residents were able to drop off leaves and green yard waste for free at the Civic Center. Approximately 26 tons of material was collected and 91 vehicles, many with trailers full of debris, were served. Waste Management staff along with City staff helped residents unload their vehicles. Goodie bags with informational items also were also provided.

This event was created in response to resident feedback during the city's transition to fully automated collection of trash and recycling. Since the warm weather this fall did not produce a frost event, leaves are staying on the trees longer than is typical. Based on feedback from citizens and at the suggestion of Mayor Pro Tem Bullock, another Leaf and Green Yard Waste Event is being planned for November 21. Staff will advertise this event in a similar manner as the first one.

104X bus route continues in 2016

The Commerce City/Denver Express bus route, 104X, is continuing service into next year thanks to community ridership. The route, which makes four stops along E. 104th Avenue on the way to Union Station, was initially funded through a federal grant and the city general fund. After almost three years of high ridership, RTD determined ridership was high enough to meet agency standards to continue service after grant/city funds expire in 2015.



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One route change effective Jan. 3, 2016, will be the elimination of the 5:50 p.m. departure from Union Station; the last departure will be 5:20 p.m. Learn more about all RTD routes and services at www.rtd-denver.com.

Second Telephone Town Hall Results

City Council hosted its second-ever telephone town hall Oct. 13, with Mayor Pro Tem Bullock and Councilmembers Amador, Douglas, Elliott, and McEldowney participating. The attached executive summary includes additional details, but here are some key takeaways:

- The average length individuals are staying on the call continues to be significantly higher than the national average of 11 minutes, meaning we are doing a good job of engaging citizens. Oct. 13's average length was 24 minutes; June's call was 30 minutes.
- We had a total of 522 attendees, with the peak participant rate of 179. This represents approximately a 30 percent decline from June, but we were competing with the Democrat's presidential candidate debate as well as Major League Baseball post-season. As we increase the frequency of these calls, it will be important to calendar out the year early to avoid conflicts or commit to a set date/time (i.e. the 3rd Tuesday of every other month).
- Twenty-Two calls went live – consistent with June. Staff is following up with four individuals who left voicemail messages for follow-up.

2015 mill & overlay project update

The 2015 mill and overlay project is scheduled to begin Monday, Oct. 26. Work will take place on the following streets/areas (see attached map):

- Holly Street, 56th Avenue to 60th Avenue
- 60th Avenue, Forest Street to Quebec Parkway
- Rose Hill North neighborhood

This project will complete the following:

- Replace 42 pedestrian ramps along 60th Avenue to meet ADA accessibility
- Install two concrete medians along with rapid flashing beacons at the 60th & Krameria and 60th & Kearney intersections to facilitate children crossing 60th Avenue and walking to Pioneer Park
- Install bike lanes along 60th Avenue, in accordance with the Walk-Bike-Fit Plan
- Removing the concrete "triangles" at 60th & Olive as the striped bike lanes will not leave enough room for these to remain
- Parking will be removed on 60th Avenue as we cannot accommodate both bike lanes and parking

The contractor indicated they will begin with all of the concrete work on 60th Avenue as well as begin milling in the Rose Hill neighborhood. Holly Street will then be milled, followed by 60th once all of the concrete work has been completed. They anticipate about a three-week construction timeframe, so all work is scheduled to be completed by mid-November except for cleanup.

Letters to residents were mailed out early last week. Door hangers will be distributed 24-48 hours in advance of construction beginning on any particular street. Both the letters and door hangers provide the Pavement Hotline number, **303-289-8118**, for residence to call and ask questions. Updated information has also been placed on the city's website.



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Councilman Douglas inquired about the westbound 104X route bus stop being moved closer to the AutoZone store to reduce the likelihood of a vehicle turning from southbound Chambers to westbound 104th and running into the bus

City staff had previously communicated to the Regional Transportation District (RTD) that the City could install the appropriate concrete bus pad and relocate the benches to the new location at no cost to RTD. Last week, city and RTD staff met on site. The agency is not amenable to making this change as there is no history of accidents, the sight lines are good and they have many other similar bus stops in the metro area that are set up in this configuration. They will continue to monitor the area for crashes and will reassess if it becomes a problem.





Callers On Each Minute




