Random Acts of Kindness Week occurs Feb. 15-19, 2016

The Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) Foundation states, "We believe that the world will be a significantly better place if we encourage the spread of kindness in schools, communities and homes – so we try to enable that in whatever way we can."

This year, the Commerce City Youth Commission is promoting RAK week at Prairie View and Adams City middle and high schools, (with a larger presence at the high schools). Promotional items during RAK week include intercom announcements, lollipops with messages, banners for student signatures, and drawings to win a gift card at a local lunch spot.

The youth commission did a similar campaign in 2014 and students still remember the impact it had on their peers.

Commerce City Recreation Center Closure of Men's Locker Room Feb. 18-21, 2016

During the 2015 recreation center annual closure, the men's and women's locker room showers were resurfaced. Unfortunately the men's locker room shower application/product was defective, resulting in the need for the area to be resurfaced Feb. 18-21, 2016. During this time the shower area will not be accessible in the men's locker room, which means no use of showers, pool or steam room during this time.

The men's lockers and toilet facilities are still available for other drop in use and/or programs not requiring showers; there is no impact in the women's locker room. Staff scheduled the project taking into consideration all scheduled activity in the pool area and recognize there is never a good time when patrons and programs are impacted by a closure. Signs have been posted at the Recreation Center, information included in the February issue of *Commerce City Connected*, the city website and social media. Commerce City Recreation Center patrons with identification cards will be able to use the Brighton Recreation Center during our men's locker room shower closure at no additional cost.

During the Feb. 1, 2016, regular council meeting, Glenn Murray spoke about tenants concerned about road conditions of Georgia Industrial Park on 106th/Havana and expressed concern for the condition of 112 Avenue near the golf course.

On Friday, Feb. 5, 2016, the public works department applied ice slicer to this area along Florence Street north of 104th Avenue. Additionally, all of the existing ice and snow was removed by the end of the day.



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To address this area in the future, the streets division will perform the following actions:

- Add Florence Street as a priority #2 street to the city's snow route map. Here is the link to the [interactive snow map](#); Florence is shown in yellow and will be added to District 6.
- Perform site checks once a week at this location to stay on top of other maintenance items such as pothole patching, sweeping and drain cleaning.

Subject: 2016 General Assembly Week 3 Legislative Report

Date: Feb. 8, 2016

To date, 384 bills and resolutions have been introduced in the General Assembly. If this year mirrors typical sessions, many more are to be expected. That either means a slew of late bills in March and April or restraint by leadership in seeing bills destined for the dustbin to be introduced at all. Commerce City is [tracking 53 bills](#) for possible direct or indirect impacts on the city, its employees, businesses and residents.

SPECIFIC LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

- **Owner-Occupied, Multifamily Housing.** Staff does not expect any construction defects legislation until later this session. The city is conceptually supportive of a bill yet to be introduced which would remove the sunset on HB 14-1017, extending a state low-income housing tax credit that is operated through the Colorado Housing and Finance Authority (CHFA).
- **Urban Renewal and Tax Increment Financing.** Staff does not expect any urban renewal/TIF legislation for a few weeks. Gov. Hickenlooper's HB 15-1348 working group is continuing efforts to reach final consensus on a meaningful change to the statutes that ensured no impairment of plans in place as of Jan. 1, 2016, and clarify significant triggers on existing plans invoke the new provisions in law.
- **Photo Red Light Cameras.** The city opposes HB 16-1143, which bans the use of photo red light cameras and is reviewing HB 16-1231 (introduced Friday) which limits the use of such systems.

OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST

- **HB 16-1078, Local Government Employee Whistleblower Protection (Oppose)**

All public employees enjoy substantial protection of their free speech rights under the First Amendment to the United States Constitution. Federal jurisprudence ensures a balanced approach to weighing the employee's free speech rights with the employer's interests. The bottom line is that employees already enjoy substantial protection to complain about governmental wrongdoing. Any claim from an employee fitting under the broad protections would prevent an employer from any other reasonable employment action because of the broad definition of "disciplinary action."

The bill passed the House Local Government Committee and now awaits action in the House Appropriations Committee. The League's current position paper on the bill is [available here](#).

- **SB 16-100, Road & Bridge Mill Levy Parity**

A 2014 CML review of 55 Colorado county road and bridge mill levies over the previous decade showed 34 counties have decreased their road and bridge mill levies when comparing the levies in 2014 from their respective high points between 2004 and 2014. Only seven mill levies were higher in 2014 than during the previous nine years. Some of the decreases have been dramatic: Jefferson County cut its mill levy in half, which slashed \$11.3 million from municipal budgets; the El Paso County road and bridge levy today is just 20 percent of what it was in 2005 (in real dollars, the loss to municipalities in El Paso County totals nearly \$5 million); Moffat County and Montrose County have simply eliminated the road and bridge mill levy altogether. Adams County's mill levy remained steady during the 10 year period.

The legislature unintentionally left open a loophole for counties to unilaterally reduce the share back to municipalities by reducing the mill levy. Counties are then able to backfill their county road and bridge funds with other revenue, such as specific ownership taxes, while redistributing the municipalities share of the road and bridge money for other county purposes. The diversions occur without municipalities being consulted and having a voice in the decision or whether and to what extent municipal revenue should be pledged by the county to other purposes.

SB 16-100 enables municipal taxpayers should rightly expect their fair share of their property taxes for road and bridge projects be returned to their municipality for that purpose, and not redistributed to other parts of counties' budgets.

- **HB 16-1191, Homeless Right to Rest Act**

In 2014, Denver Homeless Out Loud and the American Civil Liberties Union introduced HB 15-1264 that would have created the "Colorado Right to Rest Act." HB 14-1264 attempted to apply certain rights to the homeless and allowed an individual to bring suit against local governments and businesses should they believe they were harassed. The legislation was defeated last year so proponents are bringing a new version this year. While this year's bill does not contain a private right of action against a municipality, it expressly prohibits local governments from enforcing ordinances that could conflict with the rights established in the bill. Staff recommends the city oppose the bill, as local governments are best equipped to make decisions regarding the health and safety of their citizens whether or not they are homeless.

- **HB16-1155, County Control over Designated Primary Roads**

HB 16-1155 gives counties the authority to designate any four-lane controlled-access county highway a "primary road." Counties would have the following authority over primary roads in municipal jurisdictions: to grant or deny access to the highway; and the placement of all traffic control signals (unless the municipality obtains the county's approval in writing). While this bill was introduced at the behest of Weld County for one specific county road, the bill has statewide applicability. Staff recommends opposing this bill unless amended.
