

# East 104th Avenue IMPROVEMENTS PHASE 3B

## Project Wrap-up

The E. 104th Avenue Improvements Project is nearing completion on construction between US Highway 85 and Lima Street in Commerce City. The project consisted of widening the existing two-lane road to four lanes as well as building a new two-lane overpass over Interstate 76. Traffic signals and raised medians, acceleration, deceleration, and turning lanes were also included in the scope of this project. The project completes the widening of E. 104th Avenue for the entire stretch between US 85 and E-470, which will improve safety, enhance pedestrian access, increase traffic capacity, and support local business growth along this critical corridor.

On Thursday, March 24, at 2 p.m., the City of Commerce City will host a ribbon cutting event in celebration of the

lanes reopening. This event will occur on the north side of E. 104th Avenue, west of the O'Brien Canal Bridge, between Joliet Street and Lima Street. The city invites the public to attend this celebratory event.

## Construction Progress

To date, the following milestones have been completed:

- Installation of utilities including storm sewer, storm water, and sanitary sewer installation, which had not existed before; as well as the extension of the Burlington Ditch culvert.
- Paving of approximately 51,000 cubic yards of concrete on the roadway to increase existing two-lane roadway to four-lanes on E. 104th Avenue is finished.

- New bridge installation over I-76, including the placement of approximately 450 linear feet of bridge and pedestrian railing complete.

- Construction of a pedestrian underpass on the north and south sides of O'Brien Canal Bridge is complete and will allow for future trail installation.

## Completion Schedule

Remaining work to complete the project includes landscaping at the intersection of E. 106th Avenue and Fulton Street, as well as light pole installation east of Joliet Street to Lima Street. Final striping, median work and revegetation of disturbed areas will conclude the project. The light at the intersection of Florence Street and E. 104th Avenue will be an emergency flashing signal only.

# East 104th Avenue Improvements Phase 3B—Project Update

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On Tuesday, March 22, all lanes will reopen eastbound and westbound throughout the project. Occasional closures may occur to complete the project. In the spring, an epoxy overlay eastbound and westbound on the O’Brian Canal Bridge will be performed. The epoxy will absorb heat allowing for snow and ice to melt quicker, increasing safety and maintaining the integrity of the bridge. Due to the temperature-sensitive nature of the epoxy, crews will need to wait until the spring to perform the overlay.
