Colorado Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP)

A federally funded program that helps eligible hard-working Colorado families, seniors, and individuals pay a portion of their winter home heating costs (November through April). The energy assistance benefit is paid directly to the household energy supplier. If your income is up to 60% of the state median income level, you may qualify for heating assistance through LEAP.
